Pudong Shipping Week 2025



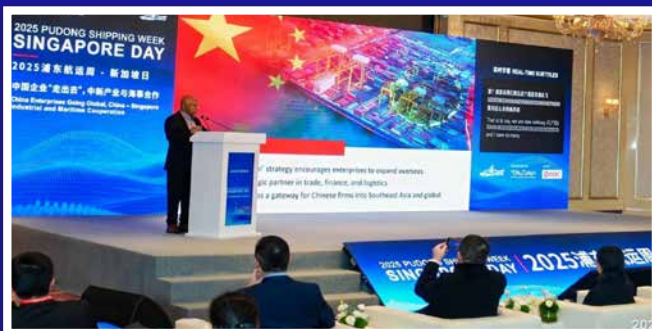
Pudong Shipping Week 2025 had opened in Shanghai, a leading international maritime center, with a focus on the industry's digital transformation and the construction of a new industrial ecosystem with the help of artificial intelligence.



The six-day event, which opened on 1 December 2025 under the theme "Navigating an Intelligent and Diverse Ecosystem," had drawn over 420 industry representatives to the opening ceremony from around the world. It covered over 40 series of events, encompassing shipping finance, maritime arbitration, the low-altitude economy, and other frontier areas. "Artificial Digital Intelligence" emerged as the key phrase at the event.

Pudong Shipping Week 2025 had provided a platform for maritime leaders, government representatives, and business executives to delve into:

- **Singapore – China Shipping Cooperation:** Exploring collaboration in maritime infrastructure, cross – border logistics, and green shipping tech, leveraging mutual strengths in the Asia – Pacific.
- **Supply Chain Security Trends & Challenges:** Analyzing resilience trends and challenges, sharing Singapore's supply chain risk prevention practices
- **Shipping Risk Management (Finance & Insurance):** In collaboration with OCBC, to discuss shipping risk mitigation and explore institutional maritime stability support
- **ESG and Sustainable Shipping Dynamics:** Navigating the transition to green shipping through in-depth discussions on core ESG related areas.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS (9 NOVEMBER 2025)

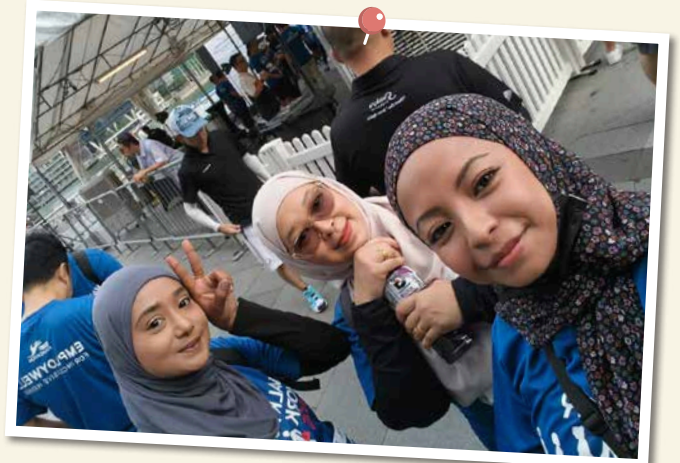

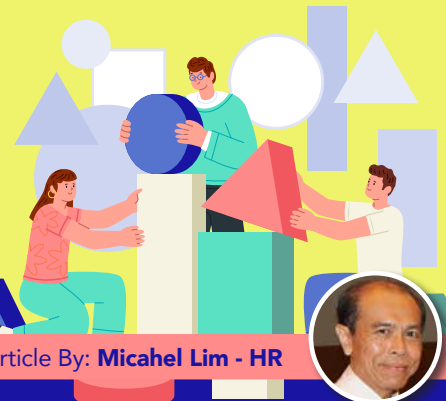
TEAM BONDING

BUILDING A CULTURE OF CARE: LAUNCH OF SANKYU'S WORKPLACE MENTAL WELL-BEING AMBASSADORS PROGRAMME



At Sankyu, we recognise that emotional well-being is essential for individuals to thrive both at work and in their personal lives. To strengthen our organisational culture of care, we have established the Sankyu Mental Well-being Ambassadors, a dedicated group of staff who serve as first responders for mental well-being support across our workplaces.

The Ambassadors play a pivotal role in providing initial support to colleagues, promoting awareness, and contributing to a psychologically safe environment. To equip them with the skills and confidence required for this meaningful responsibility, Sankyu partnered with Kaleidoscope, the appointed administrator and manager of the Well-being Champions Network (WCN), to deliver the Well-being First Responder (WFR) Programme. This programme is developed in alignment with the National Mental Health and Well-being Competency Training Framework (NMHCTF), ensuring that our Ambassadors are equipped with the competency to support themselves and support others at work.

Workshop 1: Self-Care for Sustainable Well-being 3 November 2025, Clementi Distribution Centre (CDC)

The first workshop, “Self-Care for Sustainable Well-being,” was facilitated by **Dannie Hamid**, a well-being practitioner and WFR trainer renowned for helping teams build resilience and psychological safety through coaching, psychological first aid, and scenario-based learning.

During the session, Ambassadors explored the Dimensions of Wellness Framework to assess their personal well-being needs. They practiced grounding techniques and learn to design personalised Self-Care Wheels, committing to sustainable daily wellness rituals that support long-term well-being.

Workshop 2: Resilience and Mental Toughness 24 November 2025, Clementi Distribution Centre (CDC)

The second workshop, also facilitated by Dannie Hamid, focused on “Resilience and Mental Toughness.” Participants learned strategies for resilient and adaptive thinking, practiced stress management tools applicable to high-stakes decision-



making, and designed their own personal resilience plans to sustain both performance and well-being.

Through these sessions, we hope our Ambassadors gained valuable insights and inspiration for their own journeys of well-being and purpose. By nurturing confident and compassionate Well-being Ambassadors, we continue to build a supportive workplace where every individual feels seen, valued, and cared for.

- 4) How much time needed to complete the task given?

Once we have an assessment of the work process involved, we can improvise any or all of the following to improve our productivity: -



- ✓ Change the way we work
- ✓ Get rid of disruption
- ✓ Change the approach
- ✓ Provide more support and resources
- ✓ More check-ins and discussion for better progress
- ✓ Have more competent and skillful people on the job

We have to take action in order to see changes that we expect. The more we anticipate, the smoother the work will be. For those who are carrying out the task for the first time, we need to guide them and prompt areas of concern so that we can address them.

Additionally, I initially had a very narrow view of mainly looking at job salaries and not evaluating the exposure I would get from certain jobs. I think this will affect my future decisions as I enter the working industry.

Importantly, I have learnt to get more connections because getting connections is so important in order

have more opportunities. And to learn to set aside time to make these connections. I should not be so focused on my studies and schedule and make excuses not to make these connections. So with this learning I hope to make myself more available for connections.

Overall, I think my biggest takeaway to make more connections and to get exposure importantly.

I am Narius Yau from Singapore Polytechnic, Diploma in Business Administration, Year 2.

I have learnt from this Youth Connections event and my mentor Mr. Ronnie that we should have a drive to make connections and to reach out to more people as you'll never know when they can be of assistance to you. I learnt from the office visit that fairness is also a priority as office workers are only allowed 1 work-from-home day as there are many others in the company who are not able to carry out their jobs from home and hence to eliminate unfairness, they found a middle ground. I gained a lot from insight from the office visit, like how things are stored in warehouses, how management is in the real world and being able to see a real functioning organizational structure.

My action plan is to try to expose myself to more people and take opportunities as they are given, look for exposure in the industry that I am in and try to stack experiences as much as possible right now, because at the stage I am at, mistakes are permissible and I can learn the most right now from these mistakes. And hopefully from this I can learn my niche and continue pursuing and honing this ability.

We are glad to be part of this program where we could provide some insights of the working world to young minds who are searching for possible options to pursue or not to. It provided us some insight into their world for a better understanding of the younger generation.

ON BEING A *Teacher* FOR A DAY AT SINGAPORE INSTITUTE OF MATERIALS MANAGEMENT (SIMM)!



Miss Yuki Nakamura (Assistant Manager) was given the opportunity to teach a class of 21 students from the Singapore Institute of Materials Management on Wednesday, 19 November 2025 from 7.00pm to 8.30pm.



She introduced a list of five Japanese words, Seiri (sort), Seiton (order), Seiso (shine), Seiketsu (standardise) and Shitsuke (sustain) to improve the workplace to the students simply and vividly.

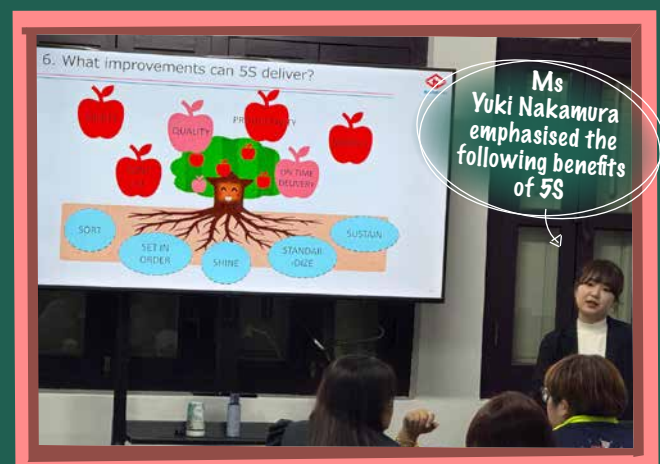
She taught the 5S to students by using a combination of experiential and collaborative methods, like hands-on activities and case studies, to make it relevant to their experiences and goals.

She presented real – life warehouse scenarios where the implementation of 5s led to significant improvements. This allows students to analyse and solve problems using the 5S methodology.

She leveraged on adult experiences; started by asking students to share their current challenges with organization and efficiency. This draws on their life experience, which is a key adult learning principle.

She facilitated collaborative tasks by organising group activities where students worked together to apply 5S to a shared space or problem. This encourages team connections and allowed them to learn from each other's perspectives.

She narrated stories about the benefits of 5S, using examples and analogies that are directly relevant to the students. Instead of just lecturing, present them with a problem (e.g. a cluttered warehouse) and have them actively work through the 5 steps to solve it. She encouraged peer teaching by having students teach a concept to each other. This deepens their own understanding and empowers them as learners. She asked relevant questions to evaluate students' understanding of the lesson.



Over time, the 5S methodology leads to many benefits, including:

- ✓ On Time Delivery
- ✓ Increased Productivity
- ✓ Greater Employee Satisfaction
- ✓ A Safer Work Environment
